






# **RECTOR'S LETTER**

#### A Time of Transition

One of the joys (and sometimes the challenges) of any new year is the sense of beginning something new- it may be a new hobby, a new job, or a desire to change or start something new in life, or change a mannerism or behavior. We typically call these things New Year's resolutions. Whatever you want to call them, they represent change and change can sometimes be unsettling and challenging for some. Most changes require a time of transition as we say goodbye to the familiar and welcome the new. As many people have discovered, this time of transition can be joyful and full of wonderful surprises. St. Peter's is about to enter a time of transition as we make some significant staff changes to two of our parish ministries.

Joyce Baker's last Sunday as our Organist/Choir Director is December 31<sup>st</sup> when we will celebrate the Christmas season with our annual Service of Lessons and Carols at the 10 AM service. A reception will be held immediately following the service in the parish hall. I think all of you would agree that Joyce has been a blessing to so many and for so many years. Her considerable musical talents have enhanced our worship and have brought joy to all of us. Her talents in directing the choir, despite some unique challenges, has just been amazing. While Joyce and Bruce will still be part of our parish family, we will miss her in her role as our Director of Music.

The following Sunday, January 7<sup>th</sup>, we will welcome our new organist, Mrs. Elizabeth Miller. Many of you know Elizabeth as she has been a teacher in our Day School for the past 14 years. She has also supplied for Joyce several times in past years. Elizabeth has a solid background in Episcopal church music. She began playing the pipe organ for daily Morning Prayer services while in high school. She studied both pipe organ and piano at the Eastman School of Music and Arcadia University. She taught music at St. Mary's Hall for 16 years and has directed children's, youth, and adult choirs. She also ran her own piano studio for 5 years and gave pipe organ lessons.

Elizabeth has extensive experience in playing for Sunday services, having played at St. Matthew's in Maple Glen (PA), Church of the Redemption in Southampton (PA), Grace Church in Hulmeville (PA), and Christ Church, Riverton (N.J.) Elizabeth knows our Episcopal liturgy and is familiar with both our church organ and piano. She is well qualified and I am very pleased that she accepted my invitation to be our organist.

There is another transition in our music ministry. Beginning in January, we will not have a weekly choir providing music for our worship services. Several of our current choir members have indicated to me that, for a variety of reasons, they will no longer be able to make the commitment to sing at services on a weekly basis. Some of these are due to health issues, others through changes in life circumstances. We will attempt to form a choir for special occasions such as Tenebrae, Lessons and Carols, and Christmas and Easter Cantatas. Whether or not we have these special offerings will depend upon the willingness of folks to commit their time and talents to needed rehearsal time and to the programs themselves.

I am so grateful to our choir members for their willingness to offer their time and talents over the years to make our worship more beautiful and meaningful for us. They will be greatly missed. But I look forward to hearing their joyful voices singing along with the rest of the congregation in the pews.

A time of transition is also coming to our Children's Ministries. Debbie Whitehorne has, for so many years, been our volunteer Director of Children's Ministries. Debbie's love and compassion has been very evident as she has faithfully served our children through coordinating and/or supervising our Sunday School, Nursery, Children's Chapel, and Vacation Bible School programs. In short, she has been wonderful!

Debbie is stepping down from her position at the end of December and Jodi McGinty will assume that position beginning in January. Jodi has served as a volunteer in several of the ministries mentioned above and will bring high levels of energy and creativity to these ministries. Jodi and her husband, Sean, and their three daughters, Gabbi, Olivia, and Marissa have been active in our church for many years. I am excited about the possibilities in the coming year in our children's ministries.

As I said, transition times can be both challenging and joyful. As a parish family, we have handled transitions very well in the past and I suspect we will do just as well with these changes. I ask you to be as supportive of Elizabeth and Jodi in their new positions as you have been in the past with Joyce and Debbie.

St. Peter's has always been and will continue to be a healthy and joyful church with quality worship services and excellent children and youth ministries. We will also continue to serve God, our community and ourselves faithfully, knowing God will bless us richly as we do so.
