Thank you for being love.





This meeting began with Evening Prayer at 7:00 P.M.

<u>Minutes</u>: The minutes from July 8, 2024, were approved with a motion from Debbie Whitehorne and seconded by Vel Shreve. It was passed by acclamation.

<u>Financial Report:</u> Charlie presented June's Financial Report. A motion from Vel Shreve to accept the financial report was made and seconded by Charlotte.

<u>Senior Warden's Report</u>: Linsey Shreve reported that she did follow-up emails to the clergy who were supplying in August. Pádraig Ó Tuama at Christ and St. Luke's for the Inaugural Jim Sell **Community Conversation--October** 26th, 5pm

The Rev. Jim Sell, who passed away in 2022, served as Rector of Christ & St. Luke's Episcopal Church in Norfolk for over 15 years. In response to his passing, Jim's family had the idea to commemorate him not in stone or bronze but by starting the Jim Sell Community Conversations Fund. This Fund is meant to be a living testament to Jim's desire to bring people together, from inside and outside the Church, to spark conversations that make a difference on topics that matter.

The inaugural **Jim Sell Community Conversation** will take place on October 26th at 5pm at Christ & St. Luke's Episcopal Church. For this first conversation we have invited the great contemporary spiritual writer and teacher Pádraig Ó Tuama to talk to us about the value and challenge of maintaining a spirit of community in divisive times and what role communities of faith can play in holding us together when so many other forces are trying to drive us apart. Mr. Ó Tuama spent many formative years in Northern Ireland, during and after that tragic period known as "The Troubles." His experience during

this time of extreme division has deeply informed his ministry, especially as the leader of the Corrymeela Community in Ireland - an internationally renowned organization engaged in the work of peacebuilding and reconciliation. His work now focuses heavily on the power of the spoken and written word. His internationally acclaimed podcast "Poetry Unbound" explores the human experience and opens doors into the perspectives of others in ways that only poetry can. He is the author of several books which explore the complicated and beautiful relationship between humanity and the divine, including In the Shelter and Being Here.

We are fully aware that the societal climate this Fall will be acrimonious, to say the least. In honoring Fr. Jim's legacy, we wanted to bring in someone who could offer us some recourse and resources to combat that anger and animosity and overcome it. We think Mr. Ó Tuama is just the person to help us in that work. We sincerely hope you will join us for this important time of celebrating the challenge of community on Saturday, October 26th at 5 PM. Doors open at 4:30 PM. A light reception will follow at 6 PM. The event is free of charge and open to all. More information can be found at christandstlukes.org/jimsellcc





St. Peter's Church was organized in 1885 and the cornerstone was dedicated October 5th, 1886. This structure still stands on Brown Avenue in Norfolk. The first worship service at our present site was in the parish hall on Christmas Eve, 1959. All existing construction was completed in 1965.
