

Priest's Letter

Eastertide

Today is the first day of Holy Week! Which means Spring has sprung, Summer is on its way, and normally things start to quiet down. BUT now that we are open, we will take full advantage of being able to meet in person. This means that starting on Wednesday April 21 at 7:00 PM, we will plan to gather in person to continue our book study of Being Christian by retired Archbishop of Canterbury Rowan Williams. We have one chapter left, discussing prayer. The next Wednesday, April 28, we will discuss the individual parts of the Eucharist. Because Sundays are a bit busy for me (being Priest-in-Charge of two parishes is fun but BUSY) I am unable to do Christian formation on Sundays. So we will continue to do some basic Christian formation on Wednesdays during the summer. Starting in the Fall, we will start Bible Study on Wednesday Evenings.

Of course, all of these plans are subject to change because of the pandemic. Please stay tuned for possible weekly updates.

Today is a special day that marks the beginning of Holy Week. We celebrate Jesus's triumphal entry into Jerusalem, when the people believed that Jesus was going to overthrow their Roman overlords and give Israel its national independence. They were not expecting their savior to be put to death on the cross. However, we know why Jesus came to Jerusalem, and though we celebrate Jesus's entry into Jerusalem today, we do so with full knowledge that Jesus came to Jerusalem to die for our sins, so that we could be closer to God.

May you have a blessed Holy Week as we go through this week together, remembering how much God loves us through the gift of His son Jesus Christ.
