



John 20:1-18 The Empty Tomb

A miracle is when something completely impossible happens. When there is absolutely no way for it to be true, yet it is. And at Easter, there are a lot of miracles for us to celebrate.

I bet you can guess the biggest one. Jesus rose from the dead! After 3 whole days of being dead, Jesus was alive again! I can't imagine a bigger miracle than that. *Miracle number 1*.

But it makes me so happy to think that Jesus didn't have to suffer for us forever. When He took our place on the cross, He was whipped, beaten, and had huge nails forced through His hands and feet. And then, carrying all of our sins, He suffered horribly in hell for 3 days. So much suffering for an innocent man. But Jesus chose to suffer so that we wouldn't have to. So that we might be able to join Him in heaven.

I think that amount of love is a miracle. For someone to love you SO much more than they love themselves, and to willingly suffer through so much pain; it's another miracle. *Miracle number 2*.

After Jesus rose from the dead there was another miracle. Jesus was buried in a small cave dug out of a rock, and to close it up they would roll a HUGE rock in the opening. It would take tons of men pushing together to get that rock to move. But when Jesus rose from the dead, that rock moved. With no one touching it, that HUGE rock moved out of the way. *Miracle number 3*.

Later that very day Mary Magdalene went to visit the tomb. When they saw the rock had been moved and Jesus was gone, she got very upset. She thought someone had stolen Jesus! But the next time she looked, it wasn't empty at all. There were two angels sitting right where Jesus had been. Angels! I call that *miracle number 4*.

At first Mary didn't understand. She thought those angels had stolen Jesus, and she started to cry. Mary turned around and was shocked to see someone right behind her. She asked didn't know who it was and asked if they were the one who stole

Jesus. But as soon as Jesus said her name, Mary could tell it has Jesus. All with one word, this man went from total stranger to close friend. *Miracle number 5.*

Then Jesus sent Mary back to the disciples so she could tell them what she had seen. In such a short time, Mary was able to experience 5 miracles, 5!

- Jesus suffered out of love.
- Jesus rose from the dead.
- The rock was moved and the tomb was opened.
- Angels appeared and spoke to Mary.
- Jesus appeared, looking first like a stranger, then as beloved friend.

Those are the things that make Easter so special. Miracles are so much better than candy. Jesus is so much better than the Easter Bunny. Angels are so much better than hunting eggs. And Jesus is so much better than it all.



Priest's Letter

April

Lent

We are now deep into Lent, a season of repentance, as we actively await Holy Week and the climax of our Christian calendar, Easter Sunday. While we look toward this special time of year, we may give thanks for those Christians who gave us the traditions we now practice. Two people in particular are St. Cyril of Jerusalem and Egeria the Pilgrim.

St. Cyril was born around A.D. 315 in Jerusalem and became Bishop of Jerusalem in around 349. A controversial leader, St. Cyril was banished and restored to the episcopate three times. Around the time that St. Cyril was consecrated bishop, he wrote a series of *Catechetical Lectures* that became the earliest instruction for those wishing to be baptized.

St. Cyril also instituted the observances of Palm Sunday and Holy Week in Jerusalem, which included several devotions to sacred sites in the Holy Land for traveling pilgrims.

These devotions influenced a nun from western Europe named Egeria who wrote the first travel log of the Holy Land. Egeria spent several years visiting, praying, and worshipping at the locations where Jesus walked, taught, and healed many. Her travel log takes the form of a letter that also details visits to Old Testament locations and gives us a detailed example of how Christians worshipped long ago.

As we keep in our minds the goal of repentance in this season, we may also give thanks for these two Christians who have given us ways and examples of how to rededicate our lives to Christ.

May we continue in our observance of a Holy Lent with all the blessings of God Almighty,
