





Please keep the Search Committee in your prayers, and please be patient with us. If you have a question, contact me or any committee member. Blessings,



Vestry Meeting Minutes

February 9, 2025

Opening: The St. Peter's Vestry met together in the Diffenbaugh Library following the 10:00 A.M. service on February 9, 2025. Attending the meeting were Kimberly Truxell, Judy Eller, Bruce Comfort, Charlie Pfeifer, Linsey Shreve, Vel Shreve, Charlotte Corbett, Nancy Comfort, and Peggy Pfeifer. Liz Kress was absent. This meeting began with a meditation by Bruce Comfort at 11:15 A.M. The meditation and counter schedules were distributed to all members present.

<u>Minutes</u>: The minutes from January 12, 2025, were read and a motion from Charlie Pfeifer was made accept the minutes and was seconded by Charlotte Corbett. It was passed by acclamation.

<u>Financial Report:</u> Charlie presented January's Financial Report. Charlie noted that on the first Sunday of the month, all open plate offerings are designated to the church discretionary account. Kimberly asked that this announcement be printed in the bulletin for informational purposes. A salary for a part time priest was omitted from the budget for 2025 and it was suggested that it be included to reflect a more accurate financial statement. Linsey Shreve motioned to accept the financial report and budget, and Bruce Comfort seconded. All approved.

<u>Senior Warden's Report</u>: Kimberly Truxell announced that Linsey Shreve arranged for Fr. J.K. Maher to celebrate on February 23rd, March 16th (changed to 9th), March 23rd and March 30th. It was agreed that the Vestry should implement the phone tree again to help keep in contact with the congregation. Nancy made up individual phone list cards which were passed out.

Junior Warden:

- 1. Sexton is working out so far. Bruce will make sure to keep an eye out and make any advisements or corrective actions.
- 2. Lawn care Bruce was interviewing a company but as of now they do not have insurance.
- 3. One of the furnace units in the church is not functioning. Climatemakers has suggested that we not repair but replace the unit. The cost of this would be approximately \$4500+ and the one on the other side is of the same age and in similar disrepair and will also need to be replaced soon. Bruce will contact them and get more information on possible repairs or replacement deals. His suggestions would be to repair at this time and implement a "Comfort My People" campaign to solicit funds to replace both later especially since we are coming to the end of the winter season. The Vestry agreed to repair it now and Charlie and Peggy Pfeifer have offered to have the Pfeifer Memorial pay for this repair.
- 4. Diamond Exterminators is switching to "Bait Stations" which includes bi-annual inspections and insurance. The cost of this is \$950.00 but we will receive a discount, and the final payment would be \$460.00. It was agreed that we should do this; Bruce will sign the contract and return it to Diamond.

Old Business:

- 1. Charlotte asked if we will continue to support the Boys Home. She did send chocolate and a gift card for Valentine's and a birthday. The original donation was made at Christmas, and we adopted one of the "homes" on campus that had 7 boys. Her question presented to the Vestry was whether we would continue to support these boys throughout the year with seasonal gifts and birthday gift cards (\$20.00 each). It was agreed to classify this under "Outreach" and continue with these gifts/donations.
- 2. The safety walkthrough with Church Insurance was cancelled (1/22/2025) due to weather and has been rescheduled for 2/18/2025.

Vestry Meeting Minutes continued February 9, 2025

New Business:

- 1. Bruce Comfort has agreed to take on the leadership of Pancake Supper. The Worship Committee will discuss this at their meeting on February 16th.
- 2. Ash Wednesday services (March 5th) are subject to approval for a lay person to distribute the ashes if a priest will bless them. A notice will be put in the bulletin for the congregation to bring in their palms. It was believed that we currently have plenty of blessed ashes for the services but the return and burning of the palms from the previous years will occur regardless.
- 3. Wednesdays in Lent will continue as usual. Different ministries sign up for duty each Wednesday. Vel Shreve will handle the scheduling. Cursillo will do the first Wednesday and Vestry will do the 19th of March. The Altar Guild, Lector/LEM, and Sunday School/Ushers will choose the remainder of the weeks available. The study included in these Wednesday gatherings will be the book <u>A Shepherd looks at the 23rd Psalm</u> by Phillip Keller. Bruce will lead this study.
- 4. Kimberly addressed the desire to have the Seder and Tenebrae on Maundy Thursday as has been done in the past. This too will be confirmed and managed by the Worship Committee. Good Friday services and Stations will be discussed also.
- 5. Bruce and Nancy Comfort attended the Diocesan Council only changes decided on was to rename it to Diocesan Convention.

The next Vestry meeting will be on March 9, 2025, following the 10:00 A.M. service.

There being no further business, the meeting was closed with the Lord's Prayer and then adjourned.
