


I Can Only Imagine


Paul, Apostle of Christ





RECTOR'S LETTER

The Gracious Invitation of Jesus

Day after day they appear. They may arrive by mail or e-mail. They may be heard on television or read in the newspapers. Sometimes they may be given in person. We call them "*invitations.*" A friend is getting married, someone is celebrating a birthday, a store is having a sale, some special event is about to happen...and you're invited!

There is a deeply personal and eternally significant "invitation" that is extended to all of us. It comes from Jesus and can be found in Matthew 11:28-30. Jesus says, "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy and my burden is light."

This is not an invitation to join a church. It's not an invitation to a system of beliefs. It's not even an invitation to keep company with a particular group of people. This invitation is to an authentic, dynamic, relevant, and life changing relationship with Jesus Christ. Jesus uses the image of a yoke to describe this relationship. A yoke was a harness that joined two animals or people so that, together, they could pull very heavy loads. When you are yoked to Jesus, you can bring to him your sins and your shame. He'll share the load and you will be forgiven. When you are yoked to Jesus, you can bring to him your hurt and your anger and your feelings of revenge and he'll share the load and bring you healing and peace. When you are yoked to Jesus, you can bring to him all the broken pieces of your life. He will share the load and he'll touch them and put them together again. When you are yoked to Jesus, you can find his peace and rest for your soul.

The world offers many so-called "remedies" to the problem of stress and some of them can be helpful and some might even work for a period of time. But the truth is there is only One who can give us the comfort and the strength that we really need. The world offers many so -called "solutions" for tensions and burdens that merely push us down and pull us apart. There is only One who can truly soothe our jangled nerves and save our troubled souls. There is only One who can say (and mean it): "Come to me all you who are exhausted and weary and worn and troubled and stressed out, and I will give you rest; I will give you comfort; I will give you the strength you need for the living of these days."

The invitation has been given. All we need do is accept it. If you haven't yet accepted Jesus' gracious invitation, I pray that you will today. It will sustain you and strengthen you for the days ahead in your life, whatever they may bring.
