St. Peter's Episcopal Church





RECTOR'S LETTER

Tragedy or Hope? The Choice is Yours

"He came to that which was his own, but his own did not receive him. Yet to all who received him, to those who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God. (John 1:11, 12)

In these two verses of Scripture we have, I believe, the greatest FACT in the history of mankind

("He came....."), the greatest **TRAGEDY** in the history of mankind ("...his own did not receive him."), and the greatest **HOPE** for the future of mankind ("to all who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God.")

The twelve days of the Christmas Season are a celebration of the Incarnation- Christ's coming as a babe in a manger in Bethlehem or, as John describes it, *"The Word (God) became flesh and made his dwelling among us..." (John 1:14).* God came to us to show us just how much He loves us and to draw us close to Him for eternity. God (in Jesus) didn't come as a stranger. Rather, He came as one who belonged. But rather than welcoming Him, some people refused to try to understand Him and who He was and rejected Him in blind anger. Eventually, they killed Him. To these people, Jesus' coming into their lives didn't change a thing.

But not everyone rejected Jesus. There were some who received Him and Jesus gave to those who believed in His Name the right to become children of God- people forgiven and loved- changed people no longer alienated from God by sin...people who will live eternally in God's presence. There is no greater **HOPE** for the future than that!

My friends, you can take the greatest **FACT** in human history- *"He came..."* and do one of two things with it. You can turn it into the greatest **TRAGEDY** by not receiving him into your life, or you can receive him and grab hold of the greatest **HOPE** a person can have- hope in the new life that is ours through faith in Jesus Christ. The choice is yours. Jesus said, *"I have come that you might have life, and have it in full." (John 10:10)*

At Christmas, you'll no doubt receive all kinds of wonderful gifts. But the greatest gift at Christmas can't be bought. It can't be boxed. It can't be gift wrapped. In fact, it can't even be given- it can only be received. That gift is Jesus Christ and the peace that comes with knowing Him as your Savior and Lord.

I pray that you will choose **HOPE** this Christmas. I pray that God will give you the grace to receive His Son-whether it be for the first time or anew. I pray that He will grant you the spiritual insight needed to know, to hear, and to understand what that holy night in Bethlehem was really all about. And I pray the He will give you the grace to allow that precious gift to change you and to change your life. Have a very Merry Christmas season and a happy and a blessed new year- 2019!
