# RECTOR'S LETTER

#### Emmanuel- God Is With Us!

You have no doubt seen by now the brochure describing the many worship and ministry opportunities available to you for the Season of Advent, Christmas, and Epiphany. There is something for everyone-regardless of age, gender, or life experience. I hope you have taken the time to read the brochure carefully and have prayerfully decided to participate in a number of these events. It's so easy to get wrapped up (excuse the pun) in secular Christmas activities and chores and neglect the spiritual side of Christmas. But remember- Jesus is the "Reason for the Season!" And besides, the Church still calls it "Christmas", not the "Winter Holiday."

The prologue to the Gospel of John contains these words- "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God.... the Word became flesh and dwelt among us." (John 1:1, 14) These are, I believe, two of the most powerful sentences in Scripture. They take us both back to the beginning and far into the future.

We are all familiar with the Christmas stories from Matthew's and Luke's Gospels. We know the characters well- there is Mary and Joseph, the angels and the shepherds, and the star and the magi. These are some of the best known and most beloved stories in the Bible. And as beautiful as they are, and as loved as they are, they are still no match for the power of John's prologue because John explains the meaning of all that happened in the other Gospels.

Our God is not One who is remote and far away in some distant realm. He is near (more than that) He is **Emmanuel- He is with us**. God coming to us in the flesh (Jesus) strengthens us and comforts us. By becoming a human being, God knows our every weakness, our every failing, our every grief, as well as our every joy, our every happiness, and our every contentment.

Whatever your situation in life, whether crisis or thanksgiving, God knows what you are going through. Jesus Christ, though fully Divine, was also fully human as any of us and experienced the whole rich range of human emotion. The Good News of Christmas is that no matter what lies ahead for us in the coming year or coming years, God is with us-through Jesus Christ. "The Word has become flesh and dwells among us...." Thanks be to God!
