Jim's Corner

o say that 2023 has been a year of learning and formation for me would be an understatement! To begin with, in January, a vestry consisting of ten individuals was elected at the Annual Meeting, an increase of six from December 2022. Several months later, one vestry member resigned for health reasons, leaving a vestry of nine. I began the second part of Interim Ministry Network (IMN) Training in January and finished the class work in August. My homework, between January and August, was to develop a "project" that would apply what I have learned from IMN to a practical need of the parish. That need, as I discerned it, and with which the vestry unanimously agreed, was to revision where God is calling St. Peter's. What is God calling us to do? What is our vision and mission? The

project I developed, and which a newly-formed Transition Team helped to execute, included four Formation Events, the information from which will be used by the vestry, at a vestry retreat scheduled for February 3, 2024, to discern our vision and mission. These Formation Events were led by the diocesan Canon for Formation, Mrs. Lynn Farlin, and held on the Sundays of September 10 and 24, and October 8 and 22. These Formation Events were informative, well-attended, participatory, and engaging. I believe that those who attended were blessed.

In October, the formation of the Search Committee began. At the November 13th vestry meeting Yvonne Authement, Greg Evans, Liz Kress, Vel Shreve, Bob Vanderslice, Patsi Walton, and Debbie Whitehorne were voted to constitute the Search Committee. The Committee Jim's Corner, Cont. from page 1

will be responsible for developing a parish profile which will be given to clergy who are considering applying to St. Peter's for the position as Rector. This profile will contain information about St. Peter's that will be important for any candidate to know about the parish. This information will include a clear vision and mission statement; our parish history; information about the Hampton Roads vicinity and the amenities it offers; information gathered from a parish survey about what St. Peter's is looking for in a rector, personal characteristics of St. Peter's parishioners, pastoral care, and feelings and attitudes of St. Peter's parishioners; St. Peter's buildings and grounds; our church organization; parish finances; the Day School; an organizational chart of the parish, and other information. Although the vestry retreat will not be until February, the Search Committee can start work on the parish profile well before then. The Search Committee will also interview candidates by telephone and/or in person, possibly traveling to see them in their home environment to experience a worship service, and to whittle down the candidates to two or three who will then be given to the Vestry for its consideration and selection. There is a lot of work to be done, and we need to trust the Holy Spirit to bring the right candidate to us, in God's time.

The Day School graduation program was held on Monday, June 12th, though the last day of school was Friday, the 16th. During the Summer months of July and August, Jason Nowland and Bob Vanderslice hosted seven Wednesday Movie Nights offering Christian-based movies for our summer entertainment. Also, from July 24 through the 28th, Vacation Bible School was enjoyed by children of the parish as well as the children of the Day School. On Tuesday, July 25th, members of the parish enjoyed an evening of baseball at the Tidewater Tides Faith and Family Night (the Tides came up short). New Trustees of the parish were registered with the Norfolk Circuit Court on October 19th. The Trustees of the parish are Charles Pfeifer (continuing as a Trustee), Kimberly Truxell, Bruce Comfort, and Linsey Shreve, all new Trustees. On Sunday, November 19, the kitchen was formally named The Rennick – "Comfort" Kitchen in thanksgiving and recognition of the work Roger and Bonnie Rennick and Bruce Comfort have contributed to the kitchen over the years.

Fr. Jim will lead the five-week Lenten program using Philip Yancey's book and DVD study of *Vanishing Grace*. Quoting from the information on the back of his book:

Countering the Bad News about the Good News

"Why does the church stir up such negative feelings?"

Philip Yancey has been asking this question all his life, a question more relevant now than ever. Research shows that in a twenty-year span starting in the mid-nineties, favorable opinions of Christians have plummeted drastically. And opinions of evangelicals have taken even deeper dives.

Yet despite the turn away from Christianity, interest in spirituality is rising. Why the disconnect? Why are so many questioning, "What's so good about the Good News?"

Even more important, how can Christians make a positive, grace-filled difference in a world of desperate need?

In this important book, ... Philip Yancey explores what may have contributed to hostility toward Christians. He then offers illuminating stories of how artists, activists, and pilgrims are expressing their faith in ways that disarm even the most cynical critics.

"See to it that no one misses the grace of God," writes the author of Hebrews. In this book, Yancey paints a poignant picture of what the world would look like if Christians fulfilled this command as a way of life.

We will meet in the parish hall, Wednesday evenings from 7 P.M. to 8:30 P.M. at the latest (we may be finished by 8, depending on the size of the group and the discussion), on February 21, 28 and March 6, 13, and 20. The book and Study Guide can be found at Christianbook.com and Amazon. The study will begin with a DVD presentation by Philip Yancey, and this will be followed by discussion based on the Study Guide. St. Peter's Episcopal Church Vestry Meeting Minutes November 13, 2023

Opening: The St. Peter's Vestry met together in the Diffenbaugh Library and via Zoom on November 13, 2023. Attending the meeting in person were Fr. Jim Hunter, Kimberly Truxell, Vel Shreve, Judy Eller, Liz Kress, Bruce Comfort, and Debbie Whitehorne. Attending via Zoom were Charlie Pfeifer, and Peggy Pfeifer.

Agenda: Fr. Jim asked all to look at the agenda for the evening and see if any changes or additions needed to be made before starting. Kimberly asked that Lay Ministry License and Chanco be added to New Business. Bruce asked that Thermostats be added under Old Business. Debbie requested that "Security Grant" be added under old business. Kimberly Truxell motioned to accept the agenda with amendments, Vel seconded. Passed with amendments by acclamation.

<u>September 2023 Minutes:</u> Corrections: "July" financial report needs to be changed to "September" and clarification needs to be added that "Bruce" will contact Climatemakers. Fr. Jim asked that the "1099" be changed to "1099 Contractor". Should add "Whitehorne" to clarify Robert's last name. A few other minor changes were requested. A motion to accept the minutes as amended was made by Judy Eller and seconded by Debbie Whitehorne. The minutes as amended were approved by acclamation.

October Financial Report: Kimberly reported on the October Financials.

Senior Warden's Report: Nothing to report that isn't under New/Old business.

Junior Warden: Nothing at this time.

New Business:

- 1. <u>Christmas Party</u> at "*Chez* Hunter" Saturday, December 9th at 6:00 P.M. to 8:00 8:30 P.M.
- 2. <u>Search Committee Candidates Approval</u>: Names of those who have agreed to serve are: Vel Shreve, Bob Vanderslice, Greg Evans, Patsi Walton, Liz Kress, Debbie Whitehorne and maybe Yvonne Authment. Fr. Jim asked the Vestry to approve the Search Committee Nominees. Bruce motioned to approve these nominations; Judy seconded. Passed by acclamation. The first meeting will be late November or early December. Commissioning will be held at a 10:00 A.M. service.
- 3. <u>Chanco:</u> Capital Campaign donation requested. Will be presented to the congregation for donations.
- 4. <u>Lay Minister Licenses</u>: Need for renewal of this through the Diocese Laura has already done this. But we will double check on this.

Old Business:

- <u>Commitment Sunday Brunch/Naming the Kitchen:</u> will be this coming Sunday November 19th, 2023. Larry and Jim will have the plaque hung in the Parish Hall and ready for the ceremony which will be held prior to the brunch. All the Vestry members will be providing food for the parishioners. Fr. Jim will be sending out an email to encourage all the parishioners to attend.
- 2. <u>Electrical Problems:</u> Debbie has two names to call to get estimates to see what it would cost to have the electrical issues addressed.
- 3. **Operation Christmas Child:** Debbie reported that it went very well, especially for our first year doing this and it will be done again next year. 21 boxes in total were gifted by the church and day school.
- 4. <u>Interim Ministry Update</u>: Search Committee has been formed. Lynn Farlin will be leading the Vestry Retreat.
- 5. <u>**Trustees:**</u> Charlie has finished this assignment and the Trustees as listed were approved by the City Courts in Norfolk.
- 6. **Bylaws:** Charlie has tried to conceptualize a set of bylaws for the church. He has been working with the canons of the Diocese and adapting for our individual needs as a church. Charlie will continue to work on them and hopefully have them completed by the next Vestry meeting.
- 7. <u>Thermostats:</u> Bruce has reprogramed the thermostats. Need to remove the covers so that when the church is in use, it can be adjusted, and the thermostat will automatically return to the schedule if they are not set back when not needed anymore.
- 8. <u>Security Grant:</u> Our application was denied. Virginia Department of Emergency Management suggested that we apply again next year.

The next Vestry meeting will be December 11, 2023.

There being no further business, the meeting was closed with the remainder of the Evening Prayer service and then adjourned.
