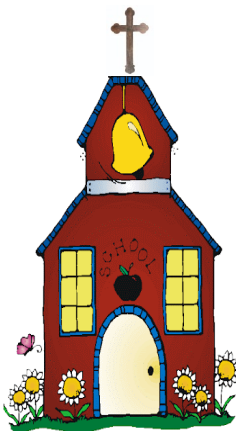

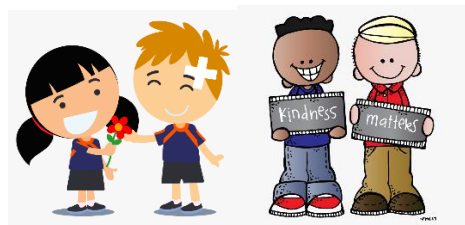

Simple Acts of Kindness

Galatians 6:1-16



You may have heard about, or experienced yourself, a simple act of kindness. These are things people choose to do to care for others. Most often no one knows who is responsible for these kind acts. They are done privately.

Simple acts of kindness are often carried out by adults, but kids are also good at surprising someone with an unexpected kind act. Let me give you some examples of what kids have done and then perhaps you will have more ideas to share.

I know a little girl who rolls down a paper towel after she washes and dries her hands in a public restroom. The paper is ready for the next person to use. It is a small thing, but a thoughtful, kind act.

Another little girl likes to leave bouquets of flowers on the porch of her elderly neighbors.

I saw a child assist an older person who was having trouble opening the heavy door of a department store. In another act of kindness, a little boy asked a fellow student, who was new to his school, to sit with him during lunch time. The two became good friends.

No one told the kids to do these things. They are thoughtful kids who find ways to make others smile. We can always look for kind things to do to make others feel special. The Bible encourages us to "not be weary in

doing good" (6:9) and the Bible also says, "So then, as we have opportunity, let's do what is good toward all men..." (6:10).

It is easy and perhaps natural to think of ourselves and what we want, but it is God's love at work when we think of others and how we can make their lives a little better. Never grow tired of showing kindness to others. You will be amazed at how your life will blossom and grow!

Jim's Corner

Those of you who have been attending worship regularly at St. Peter's, or have been coming to Friday Bible study, are becoming familiar with Jeannine and me. But for those of you who have not had the opportunity, I thought I would introduce myself to you. Why? Well, because the St. Peter's Vestry has invited me to be your Supply Priest for the immediate future, at least until we get more definitive direction from the Bishop's Office. I am honored and humbled that the Vestry has put this trust in me. I will do my best to serve you well.

I am one of nine siblings and was raised in Upstate New York, 45 miles south of Rochester, New York. My parents were both psychiatrists and my home was located on the grounds of a New York State Institution for epilepsy and mental retardation. I believe this was my introduction to learning to be compassionate to those less fortunate than myself. My father died when I was eleven and my mother stepped into my father's professional shoes and carried on as the Assistant Director of the Institution and, eventually, becoming the Director. She put all of us through college and gave us the tools of character to make us successful in life.

I graduated from Tulane University, New Orleans, Louisiana in 1976 and was actually commissioned an Ensign in the U.S. Navy Supply Corps the day before my graduation. I went to Athens, Georgia for Supply training and my first duty station was on the U.S.S. AJAX (AR-6) in San Diego, California serving as the Disbursing Officer. It was during this tour that I received the call to ordained ministry. I transferred to Cleveland, Ohio after three years to be the Navy's Disbursing Officer and, while there, began the ordination discernment process with Trinity Cathedral in downtown Cleveland. In 1981 I started attending Virginia Theological Seminary, Alexandria, Virginia and graduated in 1984. After seminary, while serving as the Curate at Holy Trinity Parish, Clemson, South Carolina, I was recommissioned a U.S. Navy Chaplain and was stationed at NOB (Norfolk) on the U.S.S. Biddle (CG-34). I was deployed to the Middle East during Operation Desert Shield and Operation Desert Storm.

Over the course of thirty-seven years, I have served parishes in New Jersey, South Carolina (where I made my Cursillo), North Carolina, Virginia, Maryland, and New Mexico. I met and married Jeannine in Virginia in 2001. I spent seven years working with Good News Jail & Prison Ministry as a Chaplain in the Charles County Detention Center, Maryland. That is where I fell in love with evangelism. Working with male and female inmates was the most exciting and rewarding work I have done professionally. After moving to Albuquerque, New Mexico to be the rector of St. Mary's Episcopal Church, I wanted to do some meaningful post-graduate work and, loving evangelism, focused on that area. I started in June 2013 and graduated from Trinity School for Ministry, Ambridge, Pennsylvania on May 11, 2019 with a Doctor of Ministry degree. My thesis title is *Confirmation, Community, and Commitment: Evaluating Church Attendance at the Episcopal Church of St. Mary, Albuquerque, New Mexico*. If you are interested in reading this thesis, there is a copy of it in the parish library. After twelve years in Albuquerque, Jeannine and I decided it was time for me to retire. We moved back to Virginia Beach because this is where two of her three sons, Michael and Scott, live with their sons. Her third son, Eric, lives with his wife and two daughters in Apex, North Carolina, just three and-a-half hours away. We both love Virginia and are happy to be back. After a year in Virginia Beach, we discovered St. Peter's Episcopal and have found a loving community here. We look forward to being with you and serving you in Jesus' name.
