





RECTOR'S LETTER

Listen to the Whisper...or Wait for the Brick

A young and successful executive was driving down a neighborhood street, going a bit too fast in his new Jaguar. He was watching for children darting out from between parked cars and slowed down when he thought he saw something. No child appeared. Instead, a brick smashed into his car's side door. He slammed on the brakes and drove the Jaguar back to the spot where the brick had been thrown. He then angrily jumped out of the car, grabbed the young boy standing there, pushed him up against a parked car and shouted, "Who are you? Why did you throw that brick? That's a new car...look at that dent...it's going to cost me a lot of money to get it fixed. What's wrong with you? Why would you do such a thing?"

The young boy was apologetic. "Please, mister, please...I'm so sorry...I didn't know what else to do. I threw the brick because no one else would stop." With tears streaming down his face, the boy pointed to a spot nearby. "It's my brother," he said. "He rolled off the curb and fell out of his wheelchair and I can't lift him up." Now sobbing, the boy asked the stunned executive, "Would you please help me get him back into his wheelchair? He's hurt and he's too heavy for me."

Moved beyond words, the driver tried to swallow the rapidly swelling lump in his throat. He carefully lifted the handicapped boy back into the wheelchair, then took out his fancy silk handkerchief and dabbed at the fresh scrapes and cuts. A quick examination told him the boy was going to be okay.

"Thank you...thank you so much...and may God bless you," the grateful boy told the stranger. Too shook up for words, the man simply watched the little boy push his wheelchair-bound brother down the sidewalk toward their home. It was a long, slow walk back to his Jaguar. The damage was very noticeable, but he never bothered to repair the door. He kept the dent there to remind him of this:

Don't go through life so fast that someone has to throw a brick at you to get your attention! To put it another way, God whispers in our souls and speaks to our hearts. Sometimes when we don't have time to listen, He has to throw a brick at us. It's our choice- Listen to the whisper...or wait for the brick!
