

## Jesus Raises a Dead Girl and Heals a Sick Woman

**Touch** is one of our five senses, and it's an important one. Touch helps us know when something is too hot or too cold right? Touch also tells us what something is and helps us know our surroundings. In the Bible today we hear about Jesus and his healing touch—that he is able to heal the woman and the daughter with his touch and his words. This tells me that not only does Jesus care for us in words and by listening, but Jesus also cares for us in all the ways that we feel, either with our hands or with our hearts.

You know, when I get a hug from one of my kids or a friend, that is a touch that can warm my heart and

make me feel loved. Or when I get to curl up in my bed with favorite pillow that is a sense of touch that makes me feel warm and safe. And when we hold hands to pray or bless one another by putting our hands on one another's head or shoulder that is touch that makes me feel connected to you and to God. So even though my touch may not make a disease go away or heal all their hurts, our touch of prayer and blessing and love can bring the presence of God and hope to another person.





### **Priest's Letter**

#### **June in Ordinary Time**

With the end of the Merry Month of May comes the end of our Easter Season that stretched from Easter Sunday to the Feast of Pentecost. And what a blessed season it was! It was so wonderful to celebrate this most holy season in person. It was such a pleasure to meet more of you, learn from you, pray with you, and for me to experience your love and faithfulness in person.

Now that we are in Ordinary time, our liturgical colors will change to green, apart from a few major feasts. Growing up, my priest caught me calling this season of the liturgical year "regular" time because we saw the same color for most of the year and the words "regular" and "ordinary" mean the same thing... or so I thought. I had to be reminded many times that "ordinary" means "numbered" because the season after Easter is numbered. The readings for the Sundays in Ordinary Time are numbered 1-29.

Though it might not feel as festive as Advent or Christmas, and it might feel like the season drags on forever, Ordinary Time is a wonderful time to get into a worshipful groove and ponder the fact that EVERY Sunday is a little Easter Sunday as we celebrate the resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ at every Eucharist.
