#### Luke 4:1-13 ~ Jesus' Temptation

What's your favorite food? Maybe you like pizza, or hamburgers, or ice cream. Just talking about food makes you hungry, doesn't it?

One time Jesus was taken into the wilderness. Jesus was there and he didn't have any food with him. That's when the devil began to temp Jesus. To be tempted is when we think we might want to do something that we know we should not do, like telling a lie, or taking something that belongs to someone else.

Jesus didn't have food with him, and he was hungry. The devil told Jesus, turn the stones into bread. Jesus was hungry, but he refused to turn stones into bread.

From the very top of the temple, the devil told Jesus to jump off. The devil said the angels would keep Jesus from being hurt. What could have happened if Jesus had jumped off the roof? Jesus might have been hurt, or even killed. Jesus didn't jump.

The next time the devil tempted Jesus, they were on a high mountain, and the devil said that everything that Jesus could see would be his if he would worship the devil. Jesus didn't listen to the devil.

When he was tempted to turn the stones into bread, Jesus said, "It is written, 'Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word of God.'" (Luke 4:4 WEB) When Jesus was tempted to worship the devil, Jesus spoke very. He said, "Get behind me Satan! For it is

written, 'You shall worship the Lord your God, and you shall serve him only.'" (Luke 4:8) Aren't you glad that Jesus reminded the devil that God had already made sure that those temptations were taken care of in the Holy Bible? What were the important words that Jesus said? Yes, "It is written...."

When Jesus was tempted, he found help in a book? That book was the Bible. When he said, "It is written," he meant, "It is written in the Bible." Because Jesus knew the Bible so well, he was able to use it to help him stand when the Devil was trying to get him to fall.

If the Bible could help Jesus like that, it can help us too. That's one reason we study the Bible—because it can help us when we need help. When we are tempted to do things we know we should not do, we can say, "It is written, I'm not supposed to do that."

#### PRAYER:

Dear God, thank you for the Holy Bible. Thank you for giving us words to say when we are tempted. We are glad that we can defeat temptation with Jesus' words. Amen.





#### **Priest's Letter**

#### March

#### Lent

March 1<sup>st</sup> marks the day before Ash Wednesday this year. Not only is March 1<sup>st</sup> the day when we traditionally come together as a parish family to eat a pancake dinner, it is also the day when St. David of Wales is celebrated! The time of St. David was a scary time. The Angles, Saxons, and Jutes, invaders from continental Europe, pushed the Christian Britons into Wales, where Christianity continued to thrive. David was born in Menevia and founded a monastery there at a relatively early age. He became Abbot and then a bishop. St. David was happy running his monastery and living a quiet and prayerful life but was dragged into church politics. There was a heresy called Pelagianism that argued that humans did not need Jesus to get into heaven. St. David was so eloquent in arguing for the true faith that the Archbishop named St. David as his successor. St. David went on to found eleven more monasteries and became the beloved patron saint of Wales.

Our tradition of eating pancakes on the day before Ash Wednesday dates back at least a thousand years! The day is sometimes referred to as Shrove Tuesday, when parishioners would be "shriven" (go to confession) and then would eat all the food that they would give up during Lent, like bread made with butter, eggs, and fat. You have probably also heard this day called Mardi Gras or Fat Tuesday in France or Carnivale in Italy.

Ash Wednesday is a time for reflection and self-denial in order to focus on our yearly promise to keep growing in holiness and righteousness. It is true that we should always strive for growth in loving and serving our Lord, but it always helps to have a season built into the calendar for all of us to corporately confess our sins, repent, and institute new practices that will change our hearts and minds to follow our Lord's example. The traditional Lenten practices are prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. These are a great start, and St. Peter's offers additional ways to observe a holy Lent. On Wednesday nights, we will offer a light dinner at 5:30, Evening Prayer at 6:30, and Bible Study at 7:00. We are adding an additional Bible Study on Fridays at Noon where you bring your own lunch. The topic of this Bible Study will be determined by those who show up to the first one on Friday, March 4<sup>th</sup>. This Bible Study is open to all. Please bring ideas of what you would like to study!!!

"I invite you, therefore, in the name of the Church, to the observance of a holy Lent, by self-examination and repentance; by prayer, fasting, and self-denial; and by reading and meditating on God's holy Word" (Ash Wednesday Liturgy BCP p. 265.).
