


AN EASTER SURPRISE for the residents at Leigh Hall.

After his resurrection on Easter Sunday, Jesus appeared to his disciples during a period of forty days. He spoke to them about God and the future that he had prepared for the people: the Kingdom of God (Acts 1:3). Forty days after Easter Sunday, we commemorate Jesus' ascent to heaven, or "Ascension".



His disciples spent the days after Ascension in prayer (Acts 1:14). Just like us, they were looking forward to the arrival of the Helper or Comforter, the Holy Spirit that Jesus promised (Jn. 17:7, Acts 1:9-11). Pentecost is the fiftieth day after Easter. This is the day when we celebrate the entry of the Holy Spirit into the life of Christians. The Apostles were so filled with the Holy Spirit, that they felt compelled to proclaim the Gospel of Jesus.



RECTOR'S LETTER

Growing Through Conflict and Trouble

Back when I was teaching elementary school, I had a sign hanging in my office that read, "Anyone who stays calm around here just doesn't understand the situation." The principal had one in his office that read, "You don't have to be crazy to work here, but it sure helps." That was more than 40 years ago, but these are still signs of the time, are they not? Stress is so much a part of our work life, our home life, our community life, even our church life. Psalm 47 declares, "God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble." If so, then where is the Lord of Calm? The storm rages all around us, and God seems to be either asleep or absent. We may sometimes wonder if God even cares. Well if the Bible is right, our God is not only the God of Peace, Joy, Happiness, and Serenity. He is also the God of the Whirlwind, the Fire, the Storm, of Trouble, of Conflict, of Stress, and of Distress. Faith in a personal God who loves us and cares for us, is deepened and strengthened, not by having us removed from life's troubling and difficult situations, but rather because of them. This is one of the great paradoxes of the Christian faith. In other words, when there is conflict and when there is turmoil, the Lord goes with us into battle-strengthening us and giving us purpose. When there is trouble in life, the Lord doesn't promise to remove the trouble, but rather gives us Himself as an abiding and comforting companion so that we don't have to face trouble all alone.

We all want lives of peace and harmony. But those things don't come to us by avoiding conflict, but rather by facing it passionately and with a purpose, and, above all, facing it knowing that Spirit of God (the companionship of Jesus) is with us at every turn, and that He will never, ever abandon us. A genuine faith costs us. We have to give up a lot of self-reliance, we have to learn to surrender, and we have to learn to do what we can. But we must also pray to have the courage to turn over to God what we cannot do ourselves. Faith is easy when things are going well for us. That kind of faith, however, tends to be lukewarm. A really strong and vital faith is reserved for those who will experience life's problems. God can and will calm the storms in our lives, but we may have to face them squarely first. And that can be quite frightening and God can seem so far away. But He's not. We may have to be at our wits end before we finally realize that, all along, God was with us. All we needed to do was call upon Him. Perhaps, someday, we'll learn to call on Him first, instead of last.
