

#### The Vine and the Branches

Can you turn a lamp light on if the lamp is not plugged in? Of course not! This reminds me of something Jesus said in the Bible. He told His disciples a story to help them understand why it's important to stay connected to Him. But He didn't use a lamp. In His example there was a grapevine. A vine is a plant with a lot of branches growing out from it. The branches have fruit on them. So grapevines have grapes on them.

Think about a branch that's been broken off of a tree or a vine. What happens to it? It withers up and dies. It can't ever have fruit on it again; it's not good for anything except firewood.

Jesus said, "I am the vine and you are the branches. If you remain in me, you will have much fruit, but apart from me, you can do nothing." Jesus wants us to produce fruit. Good fruit, like kindness, generosity, and faithfulness. Most of all, He wants us to love others as He has loved us.

But we can't do it on our own. Just as the lamp must be plugged in before its light can shine, and just as the branches must be connected to the vine before they can produce fruit, you and I must stay connected to Jesus to produce the good fruit that God expects of us.

Dear God, help us remember that we need to stay plugged into Jesus if we're going to produce the kind of fruit You expect. In Jesus' name, amen.

#### **Priest's Letter**

#### **Eastertide**

Alleluia! Christ is Risen!!! A blessed Eastertide to all!

Now that we can worship in person, the first major question to answer is: how do you worship? The worship we offer to God every Sunday is the most important activity that we, as Christians, do. As Episcopalians we pride ourselves on offering beautiful worship, where the congregation, the acolytes, the clergy, and musicians all work together to offer worship to God. Sometimes all the people pray in unison, like during the Nicene Creed and post communion prayer. Sometimes the priest prays to God on account of all the people. Sometimes the congregation and the priest pray back and fourth like during the *Sursum Corda* (Lift up your hearts. **We lift them to the Lord.**) or the Prayers of the People. These are just a few ways we worship God.

A wonderful part of being Episcopalian is that we have many options on how we may worship. With the responsibility of worshipping in the beauty of holiness (Psalm 96:9) comes the necessity to decide *how* we worship in the beauty of holiness. We will make this decision together, so that the worship we offer is both beautiful and representative of the identity of the congregation of St. Peter's Episcopal Church.

How we are going to accomplish this goal is through your participation. We will be sending out surveys, both electronically through email and hard copies at church. I humbly ask that you fill out these surveys so that we can continue to grow as Christians and continue to worship in the beauty of holiness. After all the completed surveys have been gathered, we will hold a meeting for everyone who wants to be part of this decision-making process.

It is a joy and honor to help lead you in worship. My prayer is that, as I continue to get to know the people of St. Peter's, we may all grow closer to God together.
