Sheep or Goats?

Scripture - Matthew 25:31-46 Key Verses: "When the Son of Man comes in his glory, and all the angels with him, he will sit on his glorious throne. All the nations will be gathered before him, and he will separate the people one from another as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats. He will put the sheep on his right and the goats on his left." Matthew 25:31-33 (NIV).

Who can tell a sheep from a goat?

Do you think Jesus can tell the sheep from the goats? Well, that's what our Bible lesson is about today. One day Jesus was speaking to a group of followers about the day when the Son of Man would come in all his glory. (Son of Man was a title Jesus used for himself.) He said, "He will sit on his throne and all of the nations would be gathered before him. He will separate the people like a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats. He will put the sheep on his right and the goats on his left." How did he know the sheep from the goats?

Jesus went on to explain, "He will say to those on his right, 'I was hungry, and you fed me. I was thirsty, and you gave me a drink. I was a stranger, and you invited me into your home. I was naked, and you gave me clothing. I was sick, and you cared for me. I was in prison, and you visited me.'

"When did we do that?" the righteous ones will ask.

"And the King will say, 'I tell you the truth, when you did it to one of the least of these my brothers and sisters, you were doing it to me!' "Then he will turn to those on the left and say, 'I was hungry, and you didn't feed me. I was thirsty, and you didn't give me a drink. I was a stranger, and you didn't invite me into your home. I was naked, and you didn't give me clothing. I was sick and in prison, and you didn't visit me.'

"Then they will ask, 'When did we refuse to help you?'

"He will answer, 'I tell you the truth, when you refused to help the least of these my brothers and sisters, you were refusing to help me.'

"And they will go away into eternal punishment, but the righteous will go into eternal life."

The point of this lesson is not that doing good things will get people to heaven. The point is, if we truly belong to Jesus, we will show love for others as Jesus shows love for us. That is how Jesus can tell his sheep from the goats.

Our Father, help us to show love for others as you show love for us. In Jesus' name we pray. Amen.

Guidelines for Church services

PLEASE FOLLOW THESE GUIDELINES WHEN ATTENDING CHURCH

- Do not come to church if you have had a fever within 24 hours
- Face coverings or masks must be worn
- You will enter church through the front door and exit through the red door beside the bathrooms
- Bring your Prayer Book from home. There are no books in the pews. If you do not have a Prayer Book we will provide one for you. Take it home, and bring it with you next time you attend. The worship service bulletin can be found on our web site. You may want to print it and bring it to church. There are no bulletins available in church
- Keep social distancing at all times. Walk where the blue crosses are on the floor
- Sit in the pews marked with a blue cross, 6 feet apart. Families are allowed to sit together
- Please place your offering in the plate at the door to the parish hall, as you leave.
- No socializing in the parish hall, no coffee, no sitting. Exit through the red door beside the bathrooms.
- One person allowed in the bathroom at a time. Wait in the hallway and please social distance.

Letter from the Senior Warden November 2020

Greetings in Christ!

These past few months have been a tremendous challenge in so many ways for individuals, families, churches, and of course, our Nation and World. While we as a church have seen challenges along the way as we have been dealing with the situation, we are happy to report that God is faithful! He has proven Himself over and over again through the faithful, consistent giving of people just like you! We as your vestry realize, of course, there are many whose finances have not been the same. Some have been unable to give of Tithes and Offerings like they regularly do. We are praying that God will "open the floodgates of Heaven" in a powerful way very soon.
