## **How to Pray for the Pastoral Search Process\***

When Christ was ministering to the crowds, his response was compassion and teaching. He did not tell the disciples to pray for those people. Instead, he said to pray for laborers (Matthew 9:34).

We should never forget that looking for a pastor is, first of all, a spiritual exercise. Everyone in our congregation has a part in this process. The most significant way for our church family to participate is to commit to prayer. I would like to suggest three areas that you might put at the top of your prayer list regarding our pastoral search.

### Pray for our church.

It is one thing to seek someone who will be the pastor; it is another thing to be the right church.

- 1. Pray that St. Peter's Episcopal Church will continue to seek the Lord in every aspect of its ministry. Pray that we will give attention to the most important responsibilities of the ministry. That worship will be visible, and our fellowship will be genuine.
- 2. Pray for perseverance. The search process can take time, but patience is a great teacher because it can produce growth and maturity (James 1:4).
- 3. Pray for unity. As we seek to find our next pastor pray that we, as a congregation, would put the most important things first.

### Pray for a person of God's choosing.

The Lord already knows who that person is, and we need to pray for them as we go through this process.

- 1. Pray that they will be open to the work the Lord is doing at St. Peter's and that they will be excited about the opportunities here.
- 2. Pray that this opportunity would be a spiritual journey that will mark them in their trust in the Lord and provide an example to those at St. Peter's of the importance of following the Lord.
- 3. Pray that the Lord will continue to use them where they are, as they honor the Lord by proclaiming His Word and faithfully serving in their present ministry.
- 4. Pray that this would be an adventure of faith for their whole family, as they seek together to serve the Lord in another place.
- 5. Pray that the Lord will prepare their heart for what is a mystery to them but not to the Lord.

### Pray for the Vestry and the Search Committee.

Those serving in the search need God's guidance.

- 1. There are so many aspects involved in the search committee's work in just preparing for the search. Pray that their commitment to the task will stay strong and that they will be timely in the way that they accomplish each of their responsibilities.
- 2. Pray that they will put first things first. Finding our preacher is not just an organizational responsibility; it is a spiritual duty. Pray that they would continue to seek God in every aspect and that each member of the search committee will seek the Lord's help.
- 3. Pray for strong unity in the process. Pray they will work together in a way that demonstrates love and honors all the members' input.
- 4. Pray that their choices will reflect Godly wisdom. That they will be sensitive to the direction of the Lord as they look at potential candidates and make final recommendations to the Vestry and then to the congregation.



## St. Peter's Episcopal Church -- Vestry Minutes -- September 23, 2024

<u>Opening:</u> The St. Peter's Vestry met together in the Diffenbaugh Library on September 23, 2024. Attending the meeting were Linsey Shreve, Charlotte Corbett, Judy Eller, Vel Shreve, Debbie Whitehorne, Liz Kress, Charlie Pfeifer, and Peggy Pfeifer. This meeting began with a meditation at 7:00 P.M.

<u>Minutes</u>: The minutes from August 12, 2024, were approved with a motion from Charlie Pfeifer and seconded by Vel Shreve. It was passed by acclamation.

<u>Financial Report:</u> Charlie presented July's and August's Financial Reports. A motion from Judy Eller to accept the financial reports was made and seconded by Liz Kress. It was passed by acclamation.

<u>Senior Warden's Report</u>: Linsey Shreve reported that she still hasn't been able to procure any more supply priests for our services. Rev. Brion will be returning on the 20<sup>th</sup>, but she is the only one currently scheduled. She will investigate getting approval for Rev. Dr. Shelly Ann Tenia for at least Christmas/Christmas Eve services.

### Junior Warden:

Columns in front of the church need to be repaired before painting. The estimate for this repair is \$3600.00. To replace the entire column would cost approximately \$4000.00 each. Liz motioned that we accept this proposal, Judy Eller seconded, and it was passed unanimously.

Electrical problems and lights in the church - Austin Electric has proposed to do all repairs outside for \$16,000.00. Dan (the painter) has proposed to accomplish the replacements of all bulbs in the fixtures in the church while he is painting the church walls/ceiling. This would eliminate the need to rent a man-lift twice. Another contractor – Hutton Electric has submitted a proposal for the outside work. Their proposal hinges on a "distribution test" of all the wiring at a preliminary cost of \$1750.00. They will not "clean-up" or "repair" anything that is "in the way" such as concrete, walls, etc. They have several other terms that are not agreeable, so they have been eliminated from review.

There is a grant through the Diocese whereby we would split the cost in half which Charlie is going to apply for once we get an updated estimate.

Doors are painted and look great.

Day School door and plumbing have been completed and will be removed from further agendas.

Bushes are fully removed; the ground will need to be leveled and seeded.

### **New Business:**

Sunday School and the Day School will again sponsor Samaritan's Purse Operation Christmas Child. Information will be included in *The Call*, the bulletins, and in a flyer at the Day School.

Debbie has asked that the flags be removed, and she would wash and return them.

Judy Eller has asked why we are spending more money on flowers for the altar when we could be using silk flowers. Linsey Shreve reported that Jim and Jeannine Hunter are willing to donate the cost for fresh flowers for the remainder of the year (unless already donated). Vel Shreve has suggested that the silk flowers only be used when the fresh flowers are removed on Sundays by donors. It was suggested that we table this discussion. For clarification, the flower fund has received \$1390.00 and expended \$2146.00 which means it is \$756.00 in the red.

### **Old Business:**

Boys Home visitation on Sunday was a success. It garnered approximately \$306.00 with an additional \$100.00 donated later.

Schwab Bank – Charlie is going to investigate.

Employee Retention Credit – still in the hands of the I.R.S.

Youth Group – on hold at the moment.

Search Committee – Canon Mary Thorpe is now the Diocesan contact. There are over 300 churches in Virginia alone looking for a priest. We are in the National Database. Vel Shreve is continuing to keep in contact with Canon Thorpe. She will create an announcement for *The Call* to keep the congregation up to date.

The next Vestry meeting will be October 14, 2024.

There being no further business the meeting was closed with the Lord's Prayer and then adjourned.

### **The Election of Vestry Members**

### **Canonical Requirements**

Canon 17 of the Diocese of Southern Virginia:

Section 1a. A vestry shall include the member of the clergy in charge and not fewer than three (3), no more than eighteen (18) adult confirmed communicants in good standing qualified to vote as defined in section 2. [The National Church Constitution defines an adult as age 16 and older – Title 1, Canon 17, Sections 1 & 2]

Section 2. All adult communicants in good standing.....who are enrolled as confirmed communicants of the congregation, and are regular participants in its corporate worship, unless prevented by sickness or other sufficient cause, shall be entitled to vote. [and thus serve on the Vestry]

## **Canonical Duties of the Vestry**

Canon 18 of the Diocese of Southern Virginia

Section 1. All vestries shall cooperate with the member of the clergy in charge for the promotion of the spiritual welfare of the cure; shall see that the clergy in charge is properly supported, and that salaries and pension fund premiums be paid with regularity and punctuality......further, it shall be the duty of all vestries to make and execute all contracts for the erection, furnishing, and preservation of the church edifice and other church property.....to provide for the appointment of trustees under the code of Virginia to hold the legal title to the Church property; and generally act as agents of the Parish....in its temporal business.

### Requirements/Guidelines for St. Peter's Vestry Members

All Vestry Members must ascribe to the following declaration as required by the Canons of the Diocese of Southern Virginia:

"I do believe Holy Scripture to contain all things necessary to salvation; and I do solemnly engage to conform to the doctrine, discipline, and worship of the Episcopal Church; and I promise that I will faithfully serve as a member of the Vestry of St. Peter's Episcopal Church in the city of Norfolk, according to the best of my knowledge and skill."

All members of the Vestry are expected to actively support the mission statement of St. Peter's:

"We celebrate the love of Christ and proclaim our faith by welcoming and serving all."

All members of the Vestry are also expected to .....


- +attend worship services regularly.
- +be an active participant in the life of our parish.
- +submit annually, a financial pledge to the parish operating account.
- +make attending Vestry meetings a high priority and inform the Rector if unable to attend a meeting\*
- +serve as Chair or Co-Chair of at lest one (1) Parish Commission.
- +serve as liaison between a group of parish members and the Vestry.

- +support the Rector and other Vestry members through prayer and presence.


## \*Canon 17 of the Diocese of Southern Virgina
