Our Day School is collecting Box Tops for Education. Please bring your box tops to church and place them in the box provided in the parish hall. Thank you for your support!







RECTOR'S LETTER

A Slow October?

It wasn't too many years ago that the month of October was considered a *"slow"* month in the church. There was a lull in the number of activities and events planned as everyone took a breather of sorts after a hectic September and before the busy-ness of Thanksgiving and the Advent, Christmas, and Epiphany seasons. All that seems to have changed the past several years as October has become a *"very busy"* month for many churches- St. Peter's included. In fact, this October will be one of our busiest on record. To wit:

<u>Saturday, October 6</u>- More than thirty of us will travel by bus to the National Cathedral in Washington D.C. for the National Acolyte Festival. Our acolytes will be vested and participating in the grand procession (a spectacle not to be missed). Following a service of worship and a boxed lunch they will take part in a number of workshops offered as part of the day. It will be a long and tiring day, but well worth it.

<u>Sunday, October 7</u>- Our fall Stewardship Campaign will be in full swing as each of us, once again, will be asked to prayerfully consider making a new commitment of our time, talent, and finances to God's work in our church. Commitment packets (with instructions) will be mailed to church members in early October.

<u>Sunday, October 14</u>- Our annual Parish Picnic (originally scheduled in September, but rained out) will take place in the courtyard at 11:30 AM. Hamburgers, hot dogs, condiments, and beverages will be provided. Everyone attending is asked to bring a side dish to share. There will be games and activities planned for folks of all ages- including, for the first time, a corn-hole tournament. Don't forget to wear red that day!

<u>Sunday, October 21</u>- Our Assisting Bishop, The Rt. Rev. Jay Magness will be at the 10 AM service to Celebrate, Preach, Confirm and Receive. The Bishop will also be asked to share his thoughts about *"Times of Transitions"* at a congregational meeting at 9 AM. All are invited and encouraged to attend that meeting. A Bishop's visit is a big day in the life of any parish, so I hope you will make every effort to attend church that Sunday.

<u>Sunday, October 28</u>- This is Commitment Sunday, a day on which all of us will be asked to submit a card indicating our intention to commit part of our time, talent, and finances to the work of our church in the coming year, 2019. Detailed instructions about this will be included in the Stewardship packet you will receive in early October. A *Celebration Brunch* will be held that day at 11:30 AM in the parish hall. It will be hosted by the Vestry and the Finance Committee. Bring only yourself and your enthusiasm to be part of the life and ministry of this parish family.

So, as you can see, October is chockablock full of activities and events; and you are invited to take your part in all of them. Perhaps a busy October is simply another indication that we are a lively and thriving church family....the very thing Jesus calls us to be!
