What Does God Really Want from You?

I heard about a missionary in a foreign country who led a man named Pablo to the Lord. Pablo was a poor farmer, and the missionary asked him, "Pablo, if you had 100 sheep, would you give 50 to the Lord?"

"Of course," Pablo said.

"Okay. What if you had 50 cows? Would you be willing to give 25 of those cows to the Lord?"

And Pablo said, "Yes, sir!"

"Well, what if you had two pigs? You'd give one to the Lord, wouldn't you?"

And Pablo said, "Well, that's not a fair question. You know I have two pigs!"

That's kind of the way we are, isn't it? In theory, we're the most generous people in the world. We say things like, "You know, if I made a million dollars, I'd give so much of it away. Think of all the good I could do!" But then you talk with people who make a million dollars, and you see that most of them have the same struggles with giving as the person who makes \$30,000.

That's because giving has a lot less to do with what's in your bank account than it does with what's in your heart.

You see, when most people give to the Lord, they tend to go cheap. And I think this is rooted in the fact that God is not flesh and blood like we are—He's invisible. That means we don't have to look Him in the eye when we bring Him an offering. So it's "out of sight, out of mind"


That was the problem in Malachi, the last book of the Old Testament. The people in Malachi's day were going cheap with God—because they didn't really hold Him in very high regard. The Lord says in Malachi 1:7-8 ...

"You are presenting defiled food upon My altar. But you say, 'How have we defiled You?' In that you say, 'The table of the LORD is to be despised.' But when you present the blind for sacrifice, is it not evil? And when you present the lame and sick, is it not evil? Why not offer it to your governor? Would he be pleased with you? Or would he receive you kindly?" says the LORD of hosts.

The people of Israel were thinking, Hey, God really doesn't care what we give Him. Let's just sacrifice our rejected animals—the crippled and the blind ones. The Lord responds, "Try giving a trash gift like that to your governor and see how happy he is with it!"

Our God is an awesome King—far greater than any worldly ruler. Yet all too often, we fall into the habit of giving Him our scraps so we can keep the good stuff for ourselves. But when you begin to give from your heart—with the attitude of making every gift your best—you learn what it truly means to live beyond yourself. And that's what God really wants!





Vestry Meeting Minutes

July 8, 2024

Opening: The St. Peter's Vestry met together in the Diffenbaugh Library on July 8, 2024. Attending the meeting in person were Fr. Jim Hunter, Vel Shreve, Linsey Shreve, Judy Eller, Charlotte Corbett, Debbie Whitehorne, and Charlie Pfeifer, and Peggy Pfeifer via Zoom. Liz Kress was absent. This meeting began with Evening Prayer at 6:55 P.M.

<u>Agenda</u>: A motion to accept the Agenda was made by Charlie Pfeifer, Vel Shreve seconded. The motion carried unanimously.

<u>Minutes</u>: The minutes from June 10, 2024, were approved with a motion from Judy Eller and seconded by Linsey Shreve. It was passed by acclamation.

<u>Financial Report:</u> Charlie presented May's Financial Report. A motion from Vel Shreve to accept the financial report was made and seconded by Jim.

Rector's Report: On June 12th, Jim hosted the final Day School Graduation program and presented to Connie Townsend an honorary title of "Teacher Emeritus" upon her retirement at school's end. She was also presented with a check from donations made to the church on her behalf. She is retiring after 30 years as our Day School Kindergarten teacher. Fr. Jim brought communion to Mr. & Mrs. Laine. He also made a pastoral call on Ms. Alexander.

<u>Senior Warden's Report</u>: Linsey Shreve reported that she did not have much to report. There was an inquiry by S. L. Nusbaum looking for facilities for a group which would require much more than we are able to provide including overnight accommodations.

Junior Warden: Nothing that is not covered under "Old Business"

New Business:

<u>Coffee Hour</u>: Fr. Jim discussed Jeannine's concerns that the coffee hour following the services continue while they are gone.

Old Business –

- 1. Yard Maintenance several bushes need to be removed or cut back to improve safety and lessen the cost of maintaining them. The bushes identified were the two on either side of the day school walkway and the one beside the sidewalk leading to the office. The cost of all three being trimmed back and allowed to regrow is \$300.00 and if we have them removed the cost is \$450.00. Fr. Jim made the motion that all three be removed, Charlie seconded, and it passed in a 6-2 vote.
- 2. Boys Home, Covington will be explored later.
- 3. Schwab Bank Charlie will do more investigating. It has been tabled for now.

- 4. Red T-Shirts still have them out. Approximately \$10.00 has been donated. 15 or so remain.
- 5. Lead testing has been completed and we passed.
- 6. Electrical Issues in the Day School and Church waiting on money.
- 7. Day School Door and Plumbing in progress.
- 8. Buildings and Grounds Grant Guidelines Judy Dobson Charlie will see her next week to discuss.
- 9. Dominion Energy Efficiency Service excellent report and shows a lot of work that was accomplished.
- 10. Painting of Doors Dan Smith still delayed due to Mr. Smith's physical incapacity.
- 11. Termite Damage another item that we are waiting on money to accomplish.
- 12. Employee Retention Credit this is the money several projects are waiting on and we have not received an update. Charlie will call for an update when he returns to the States.


The next Vestry meeting will be August 12, 2024.


There being no further business the meeting was closed with the remainder of the Evening Prayer service and then adjourned.
