Senior Warden Report 2020

Many challenges for us at St. Peter's in this year of 2020. The Covid-19 pandemic surfaced in April and Bishop Susan closed all churches in our diocese to avoid further spread of this awful virus. While we were not gathering in our church, we were able to begin "live streaming" the services using Morning Prayer. With the help of Bob Vanderslice, Jason Nowland, and Brian Pfeifer, and many others, we developed our Live Streaming which has given us the opportunity to reach many of our shut-ins who could not attend in person worship and those who were not comfortable attending in person worship due to the Covid-19 virus. The diocese helped us put together a regathering plan to begin to open our church. Once we had an approved plan St. Peter's regathered on August 2, 2020 with Morning Prayer. A few weeks later we were able to celebrate Eucharist using the "World Cups." We continued to remain open with the appropriate social distancing, using masks and contact tracing, until the numbers began rising after Thanksgiving and we were forced to go back to virtual worship services, not knowing when we will be able to gather together again. It has been a challenge to say the least, but when we put God in the front of all the obstacles, there is nothing we cannot do.

John Eidam+ our rector for the past 23 years retired in July 2020. With all he has supplied us with, through worship, bible studies and strong leadership, because of his leadership, St. Peter's being a strong family congregation, we continue to accomplish much all to the glory of God, as we continue in our ministries here at St. Peter's. And many thanks to all the volunteers, ministry leaders, and Staff, Vel, Elizabeth, and Carolyn for all the hard work trying to keep us moving in the right direction.

With the beginning of a new year and looking forward to our new Priest-in-Charge, Rev. Jesse Lassiter coming in January, I am hopeful that we can get back to some sense of normalcy, not only in worship, but also in moving forward with our ministry plans. Due to this pandemic, and the fact that we can no longer afford a full time Priest, I do believe that some things will never be the same, but that does not mean that we will change who we are. We are and always will be the same St. Peter's family. Having a Priest -in- Charge in conjunction with another church, St. Brides will be challenging to say the least, but my heart tells me that we can overcome and conquer with God's Grace and your support.

We need to continue to improve the building and grounds through a maintenance group of men and women who are willing and dedicated to assist in the maintenance of St. Peters.

Christian Education Report- 2020

As with everything else in the year 2020, the Christian Education program was significantly disrupted this year. With social distancing and quarantining, Sunday School was available only from January to March.

The children love to participate in the service by assisting the teacher with the liturgy, singing the Doxology, walking the offering to the altar, and reciting the Lord's Prayer. They then practice the chosen song for the month, which is sung in front of the congregation on the last Sunday of every month. The children then go to their assigned classroom for the lesson.

In the classroom, that particular Sunday's gospels lesson is read from a children's Bible and discussed in a manner easily understood by the children. The lesson taught is compared to modern-day experiences that the children can relate to. The same gospel is read during the adult church service, allowing families to discuss the Gospel lesson together. After the reading, the children complete an activity worksheet that reinforces the day's Gospel lesson. They also create a craft, that is often displayed in the church hallway for all to see and appreciate. The children enjoy the crafts and the opportunity to use their imaginations.

Prayer Shawl Ministry Year End Report 2020

We have a group of 9 that crochet/knit/loom shawls that are prayed over as they are made. These shawls are then given to those that are shut in, ill, or are experiencing a difficult time in life. to provide them comfort and remind them that God is with them in their time of need.

Knitted/crocheted/loomed hats and scarves are also part of our way to help the homeless in our area. To date, we have crafted 13 hats.

Our ministry also extends to area hospitals. Newborns and preemies benefit from this ministry by receiving hats and preemies receive blankets that we have knitted/crocheted/loomed. To these babies we have provided 41 infant hats, 149 preemie hats and 7 blankets.

We are also providing Pocket Prayer Shawls to anyone that would like to have one, either for themselves or for loved ones that are going through an unsettling time in their life. They are created to give comfort and support to the recipient. They travel nicely in a pocket or purse to give healing thoughts and the closeness of God.

We suspended our meetings, of course, during this Covid crisis but we didn't stop our dedication to this ministry. We continued to provide hats to newborns, as well as Chemo Caps for distribution to patients at Va Oncology during this time. As of November, we were able to supply these patients with 291 caps. If you know of anyone that is in need please let a member of our group know and we will be happy to supply a cap to them. They are one-of-a-kind caps so the recipient will be receiving an original handmade cap.

Another blessing that came our way again this year via the Chauncey family was a donation, through their friend, of baby blankets and baby shawls. 16 baby blankets were given to area hospitals. The baby shawls that we received, will be sold to raise funds for our various ministries. We have 10 of these shawls available at \$40.00 each-their value is well over \$100. Should you be interested in purchasing one of these please contact me or the church office.

Another act of kindness came from Debbie Whitehorne for her generous donation of lap blankets and mittens that we were able to provide to Providence Place of DePaul and Commonwealth Memory Care.

As you can see, we have not let the Covid crisis stop our efforts of providing for those in need. We would like to thank all that have donated yarn and hooks/needles/looms so that we can continue with this Ministry. A special Thank You goes out to BJ Neaves for her continued support in this area.

We meet on the first Tuesday of the month and welcome new members, whether experienced or inexperienced, to join the prayer shawl ministry at any time during the year. We have some really good teachers that will help no matter what your experience level. Come help us share these good tidings.

ST. PETER'S DAY SCHOOL

Annual Report-2020

St. Peter's Episcopal Day School exists to serve the community by providing quality Christian Education in an atmosphere that is both caring and nurturing. We seek to minister to the spiritual, as well as the physical and emotional needs of our students. This is accomplished through our comprehensive early childhood developmental program. Our curriculum, policies, and class activities reflect Christian principles and ideals, and seek to nurture in each child an appreciation and respect for himself/herself, home, family, church, and country. Computers in each classroom are equipped with software designed to develop age appropriate skills for the three, four and five (kindergarten) year old classes.

Like most people and businesses, to say that this has been a challenging year is a gross understatement. A PPP loan allowed us to keep our staff together, but the rules limited our enrollment. State grants have helped but enrollment remains at a critical level with the biggest problem in Kindergarten. We are having problems competing with the enhanced kindergarten programs being offered at no cost by the public schools. The Day School cash reserves are low, providing little cushion to pay unexpected expenses. The issue is enrollment. The change in enrollment by just a few students can make a significant difference in the financial health of the Day School.

Two-year-old enrollment is very close to capacity with 8 students. Our enrollment currently stands at 40 students-ages 2 through 5 years (Kindergarten). More and more families seem to be getting after school day care from grandparents rather than our extended care program. The Extended Care enrollment is currently about 24 children. Our staff includes Mrs. Vel Shreve (Acting Director), five teachers and two teacher's assistants. Laura Kallestad is the supervisor of our extended care and summer camp programs. There are three aids assisting Laura.

Our Day School Board of Directors meets monthly and its members are: Charlie Pfeifer (Chairman), Vel Shreve, Liz Kress and Caroline King. We would like to increase the board membership. If you would be interested in serving on our Day School Board, please contact Charlie Pfeifer or Vel.

As Covid 19 allows, all parish members are invited to attend our Annual Christmas Program as well as our Annual End-of -the-Year Program. It is a great way to experience firsthand the results of the dedication and hard work of our students and staff.
