**From Laura: My family member is a retired Park Police IT specialist and is kept aware of new (and the resurgence of old) scams used to target individuals throughout the world. This is one of his latest warnings - please, please, please read, beware and be aware. Spread this information to all family and friends who may not know about this or are vulnerable!

Beware of Brushing Scam!

A recent scam has been showing up in many states. A "brushing" scam is when someone receives an unexpected gift or item not ordered in the mail from a place like Amazon or other company. Examples of gifts include, rings, bracelets, necklaces, Bluetooth speaker, etc. The gift will have the recipient's address, but not include the sender's information or be from a known retailer. When the recipient opens the package to see what it is and possibly who sent it, there is a QR code to scan to find out who sent the gift.

Once the code is scanned, all the information from that phone will be sent to scammers. They receive all access to the phone. All personal and financial information is accessible to the scammers and often the victim's bank accounts are drained.

The gift can be kept or thrown away, but the QR code should NOT be scanned for any reason. QR code scams are nothing new. These scams show up in all places, including parking meters.

Inform your family members about the scam and avoid scanning any unknown QR codes included in the package.



Vestry Meeting Minutes

November 17, 2024

Opening: The St. Peter's Vestry met together in the Diffenbaugh Library on November 17, 2024. Attending the meeting were Linsey Shreve, Judy Eller, Vel Shreve, Charlie Pfeifer, and Peggy Pfeifer. Debbie Whitehorne, Liz Kress, and Charlotte Corbett were absent. This meeting began with a prayer at 12:30 P.M.

<u>Minutes</u>: The minutes from October 14, 2024, were approved with a motion from Charlie Pfeifer and seconded by Judy Eller. It was passed by acclamation.

Financial Report: Charlie presented October's Financial Report. A motion from Judy Eller to accept the financial report was made and seconded by Vel Shreve. It was passed by acclamation.

Senior Warden's Report: Linsey Shreve reported that Rev. John Francis Maher will be returning on the 1st, 8th, 15th, Christmas Eve, and the 29th of December.

The next meeting is December 8th following the 10:00 A.M. service.

Junior Warden**:

**In Debbie's absence the following topics were discussed with as much information as possible by both Laura Kallestad and Charlie Pfeifer.

Shrubs/bushes around the Day School have been removed and dirt has been leveled out for drainage.

The carpet in the alcove to the Narthex has been replaced.

Charlie met with All Trades to discuss the repairs and painting of the electrical boxes only and replacing the conduit going to the Day School. One box is more complicated than the other and will require more investigation and may require removing the sidewalk in addition to replacing the conduit. Charlie is expecting a bid on the work shortly and at that time he will contact Judy Dobson for the grant information. If we go ahead with the electrical work, the electricity will be turned off for approximately 2 days. During this time, the wood on the facia above the electrical lines will be repaired and painted by Dan Smith (the company that did the doors and column painting and repairs).

Old Business:

- The Boys Home collection will be taken from the loose plate collection in the first and second week of the month and with direct donations. The money will be sent to the house parents after the 8th of December.
- Pledge "Thank you letters" and the 2nd notice letter will need to be sent shortly. Charlie will handle the letters and get back with Laura with mailing instructions.

New Business:

- Lay Delegates and Alternatives notice was posted throughout the church for volunteers and no one responded. The Bishop's office had already called, and we will not be represented this year.
- The Acolyte guild is trying to get the younger children involved but the cross that is used in the church currently is way too heavy for them to carry. Judy Eller would like to purchase a smaller cross for them to carry in the procession. The children cannot hold the larger cross and that would limit youth involvement. It was decided that this cross, if purchased, would not replace the traditional processional cross but would instead be used to "lead" the children from the church to Sunday School.


The next Vestry meeting will be December 8, 2024.


